Enjoy roaming the work environment of artist **Brian Boles** and don't forget to surround yourself at **Gallery339** by original paintings by award-winning artist, Terry Thirion and other artists. On your way in or out of Hot Springs business center, don't forget to visit the **Laurel River Store** with its eclectic offering of arts and crafts, and enjoy an ice cream too.

Appalachian Barn Alliance of Madison County

The Appalachian Barn Alliance (a non-profit organization based here in Madison County) began this year by celebrating its 10th anniversary. When they formed in 2012, the

goal was to preserve the area's agricultural heritage (inspired by an idea by retired County Extension Director Ross Young). **The ABA has been doing that by documenting almost 100 historic barns.** Now, they have a focus on restoring and rebuilding a few existing as well as donated barns on the Smith Heritage Farmstead at the Bailey Mountain Preserve just minutes from the town of Mars Hill.

After 2 years of cancelling events because of COVID restrictions, they brought back two popular events in 2022 and were awarded two grants. One event was the Second Annual Pastoral Palette Art Gala in June – an art exhibit with drinks and finger food. **The other was the Seventh Annual Barn Tour Day which offered tours of 3 barns in the Hot Springs area and a BBQ dinner at the Lodge at Bear River with music by fiddler Roger Howell. Using those funds plus money received from the Madison County**



Tourism Development Authority, the ABA is overseeing the restoration of a second barn—a burley tobacco barn—on the Smith Farm this Fall.



Another annual event that the ABA is proud to sponsor is a field trip for all 4th grade students to the Smith Farm to bring alive a section of the state history curriculum. They launched their inaugural field trip in May with a grant from the local First Bank.



The organization is proud to have over 200 members who help them with their goal of raising awareness and pride in the agricultural heritage of the southern Appalachian area as exemplified by the beautiful barns that dot the landscape in Madison County.


