Paint Rock Preservation Efforts

This ancient pictograph is located along the River Road near Paint Creek, about 20 feet up on the cliff face. Testing has indicated that it was created nearly 5,000 years ago.



The painting itself remains a mystery, though often thought to convey to the woodland Indians the location of the hot mineral spring waters.

We are all stewards of our heritage and history, and are fortunate to have this remarkable cultural site here near Hot

Springs, NC. It is pursuant on all of us to protect it because it is very vulnerable. There is nothing else like this in the rainy, temperate Southeast, as most prehistoric rock art has been eroded away.
