Fireworks Celebrations in July

Hot Springs will have its celebration on Saturday, July 2nd. Come early to enjoy the shops, restaurants and vendors downtown before the fireworks at dark.

Fireworks will be rocketed from the water tower north of town near River Road. **People may gather downtown**

and at the elementary school grounds. The school has a great view and additional parking in designated areas such as the teacher lot, front circle, bus area, or along roadways so as to not impede traffic.

Our Volunteer Fire Dept will have someone there to monitor the area and accept donations. Please plan to carry out your trash.

*Note that only guests who have signed a waiver are allowed on the Hot Springs Resort & Spa property to view fireworks.

<u>Laurel Community Center will host its Freedom Festival on Saturday July 2nd.</u> They will have live music, food, fireworks, and fun for the whole family beginning around 2pm. There is also a 5K Road Race in the morning from 9-10am. <u>Sign Up for the 5K here</u>

June 6 - 11am at Pine Hall (64 S Spring St) - Junior Appalachian Musicians will perform (all ages) - Don't miss the opportunity to listen to local favorite, the Junior Appalachian Musicians (J.A.M.)



perform in Hot Springs. This group is comprised of local youth, age 5-17, who are learning and performing Appalachian traditional music, which often includes fiddle, banjo, guitar, mandolin, a junior and senior string band, and dance. June 20 - 11am at Hot Springs Library - Pollination- Do you love to eat? Learn why we must have pollinators!! (geared for kids but all ages welcome)

June 28 - 11am at Hot Springs Library - STEM Lab - Crash Test Cars (for kids) - Engineer with LEGOs to construct a car that will make it through a crash test undamaged. We will briefly discuss car safety mechanisms, then put them to the test.

July 5 - 1pm at Pine Hall - River Conservation and Fly Fishing 101 for teens and adults - registration required so we can plan for group size - https://bit.ly/mcpl-fishing

July 11 - 11am at Hot Springs Library - Deep Sea Science with the Hands On Museum of Hendersonville - Learn about the bottom of the deep blue sea as we learn about the creatures living in the ocean.
